New opportunity - The Community Research Networks

UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) and The Young Foundation have just launched a new funding program – **The Community Research Networks** – that seeks to put communities at the heart of the research. Over the next four years, UKRI is investing more than £4m to support grassroots groups, community organisations, charities, and local government as they develop the capacity to produce research collaboratively, and as they partner and connect with research institutions and organisations to form Community Research Networks.

The first **Expression of Interest phase** has just opened and will provide a total pot of £500,000 in 'expression of interest' grants for organisations to spend developing proposals to form local/regional Community Research Networks.

Funding of £25,000 per project is available to applications that explore how a network could solve local needs such as building relationships, developing and sharing knowledge, and local capacity-building and collaborative research.

Funding for the expression of interest phase must be used to support the collaborative development of bids for the next "Implementation phase", with activities such as hosting workshops, engaging communities, convening discussions, and building partnerships. The Implementation phase (second phase of funding) will then open in April 2023, providing long-term, sustained funding to implement and embed Community Research Networks over three years. A further £3.5 million has been allocated for the Implementation phase, which will support a minimum of five networks.
