The FRC will assist with issue reporting and asylum payment issues directly and will direct calls that need advice from a specialist adviser to our Eligibility Advice and Guidance Line (EAGL) such as those who need assistance with S98 applications, ASFs and COCs.

TRAINING

Fully funded English and Maths Functional Skills courses for those aged 19 and over

University of West London will be offering fully funded English and Maths Functional Skills courses for London residents who have not previously achieved a GCSE grade C or above in these subjects.

To be eligible for funding for these courses, you will need to meet the below criteria, and not currently be undertaking an apprenticeship.

- Were aged 19 or above on 31 August 2021, and Live in London, and
- Are a resident of an EEA (European Economic Area) country, and
- Have lived in an EEA country for the past 3 years

These courses typically take place on two days or a few evenings per week, over a 4-6 week period.

If you meet the above criteria and are interested in taking a Functional Skills maths and/or English course, please complete the expression of interest form [by clicking here](#).

Once you have registered your interest, the University will be in touch to confirm the next steps and share the details of upcoming courses that you can book on to. At the end of the course there will be an **in-person exam at their campus at St Mary's Road, Ealing**.

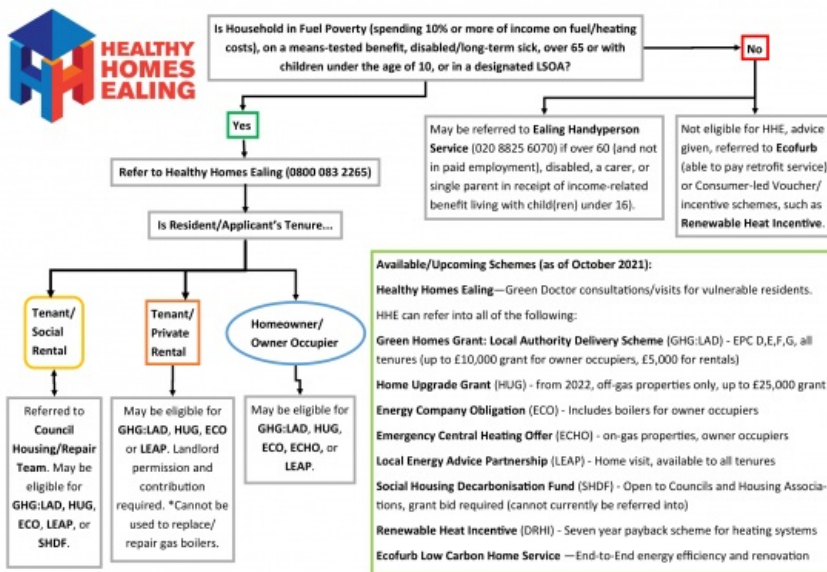
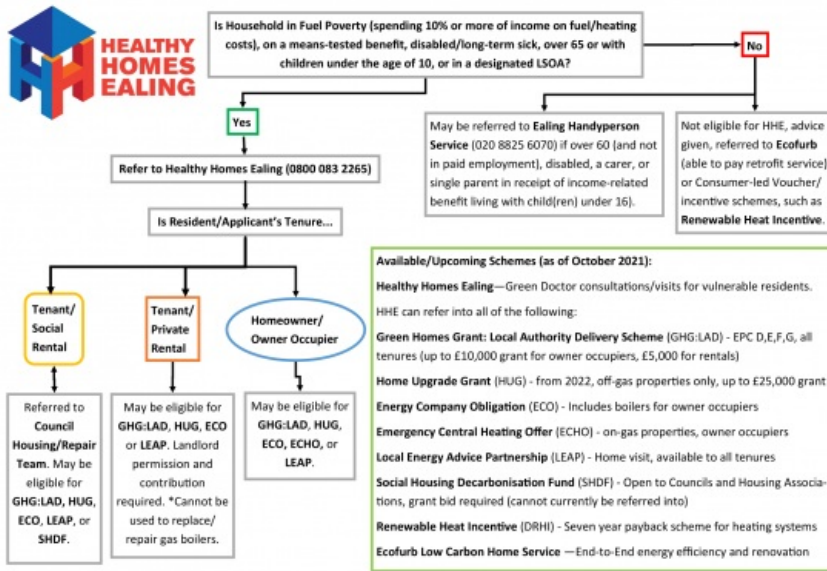
